Scenic Drive, TSD Rally, Rocker Cover Racing, Cocktails, and a Lake Cruise

Today is our “long drive”. You will find all the details on page 23, but to summarize, whether you are on the **Scenic Drive or the TSD Rally**, the route is the same. We’ll leave Big Bear on scenic Highway 38, eventually reaching Onyx Summit at an elevation of 8,843 feet, one of the highest passes in Southern California. From there it’s all downhill, WAY downhill. We don’t get to sea level but at its lowest point, the elevation in **Joshua Tree National Park** is only 934 feet!

The landscape at our destination couldn’t be more different from Big Bear, but starkly beautiful in its own right. The unique Joshua Trees, sometimes appearing in clusters, and sometimes starkly solitary, are worth the drive.

After touring Skull Rock

and the Oasis Visitor’s Center, it’s back into **Twentynine Palms and Yucca Valley** to find a place



for lunch, followed by a bit shorter drive up the “back way” into Big Bear. In all, the route today is a bit over 200 miles and will take around five hours. For those who don’t want to commit to that distance, we have an assortment of shorter drives to choose from.

If you are staying around the hotel or have some free time, don’t forget that the **Silent Auction** is open from 5:30 p.m. Get in there and place your bids. Also, please stop into the Boulder Bay Room (Social Center) and vote for your favorite photographs and arts and crafts entries. You will find your ballots in your name tag holder. See details of these opportunities on page 19.

At 4 p.m. you can watch the practice and preliminary rounds of **Rocker Cover Racing**.

The “sport” was imported into the US by our very own Ed Neumeyer after he saw his first action in Australia. Rocker Cover Racers aren’t all about speed either, there is a “presentation” component. If you have not seen these vehicles before, you might be surprised at the creativity. And you get to vote for your favorite. See you in the Portico.

That is of course unless you are on one of the optional **Paddlewheel Cruises** tonight, the first leaving at 5:00 p.m. and the second at 7:00 p.m. See the details and directions to the Marina on page 24.





SCENIC DRIVE AND TSD RALLY INFO

On Tuesday we will enjoy our “long drive” featuring a visit to **Joshua Tree National Park**. Both the Scenic Drive and the TSD Rally will use the same route. TSD participants will be challenged to cover the route in the target time and distance, while Scenic Drivers will wander as they please. The route is a bit over 200 miles and will take about five hours to drive, not counting lunch and other stops.

Rally Drivers

Meet under the hotel Portico at 8:30 a.m. for a briefing and to receive the route directions. No special equipment is needed to participate in the Rally, a stopwatch (or cell phone) and your odometer are all you need. Bring sunscreen and sunglasses! Pack some water. You should plan to depart shortly after the meeting, so you are out ahead of the Scenic Drivers.

Scenic Drivers

Meet under the hotel Portico at 9:00 a.m. for a briefing and to receive the route directions. You can depart anytime you like thereafter. Bring sunscreen, sunglasses, and water.

The Roads

You will be traveling two of California’s “Scenic Highways”, Hwy 38 down the hill and Hwy 18 up the hill. In between you will experience both High Desert and Low Desert environments and an elevation change of over 7,000 feet. All roads are well paved, and gas is readily available once off the mountain. Unfortunately, the Hwy 38 area was the scene of an extensive forest fire last year. While it will recover, its “Scenic Highway” designation may have to be suspended for a few years. It’s still a great driver’s road.

Lunch

You might choose to have lunch before or after visiting the Park. A list of recommended local restaurants is included with the route directions. Additionally, there are dozens of fast food

and chain restaurants on the stretch of Hwy 62 between Yucca Valley and 29 Palms, about halfway through the drive.

Joshua Tree National Park

You will be entering the Park via the **East Entrance** in 29 Palms at the **Oasis Visitor Center** (*not the West Entrance in the town of Joshua Tree which you will pass first*). At the Oasis Visitor Center, you will have the chance to see a real desert oasis (the Oasis of Mara), which has been a beacon of life for millennia. There is a good museum and gift shop at the Visitor Center as well.




The park entrance fee is \$30 per car, collected at the Visitor Center. If you have a National Park Pass, entry is free. Be sure to pick up a Park Map and maybe a Guidebook.

Once inside the Park you will drive through most of the varied ecosystems and see hundreds of Joshua Trees. A stop will be made at Skull Rock, the most photographed spot in the Park. Feel free to wander off the prescribed route and enjoy some of the Park’s many and varied attractions.

Route Too Long for You?

You can cut about an hour off the drive by skipping the loop into Joshua Tree National Park (not to mention the \$30 entry fee if you don’t have a National Park Pass). Simply Drive to the Oasis Visitor’s Center, have a look around and head back the way you came, picking up the route directions again at Instruction 11.

For even shorter options, consider the Optional Drives shown on pages 25-28.


Big Bear Queen Paddlewheel Cruise Info

If you signed up for one of the five Paddlewheel Cruises, your tickets will have been issued at Registration. Each Cruise is 90 minutes in length and departs from the Pine Knot Marina (439 Pine Knot Avenue), which is about a ten-minute walk from the Hotel.

*Be sure to arrive at least 15 minutes before you scheduled sailing time to allow time to board. **You must travel on the Cruise you have booked. All cruises are FULL, so it is not possible to take an alternate cruise.*** Cruises are BYOB and snacks (alcohol OK). There are restrooms on board.

Directions to the Pine Knot Marina (on foot):

1. From the Hotel Entrance, turn LEFT onto Village Drive
2. In 500 feet, turn LEFT onto Pine Knot Avenue
3. In 600 feet, cross over Big Bear Blvd. and Into the Marina
4. The Boat Dock is 200 feet ahead. Look for the Big Bear Queen Signs. There is parking if you choose to drive.



Gymkhana and Funkhana Event Info

Both Events will be held at the Big Bear Airport from 10am to 2pm on Thursday. Gymkhana participation requires advance sign up. The Funkhana event does not require sign up, just show up. The Airport is located 5 miles from the hotel, about a 12-minute drive.




If you are not participating in the Gymkhana/Funkhana, Thursday is a bit of a free day, at least during the morning and early afternoon. If you are looking for an additional driving excursion and some more sightseeing, we have you covered.

The suggestions which follow are arranged from shortest to longest.

LAKE ARROWHEAD LOOP TOUR

Drive Time 2 Hr 20 Min; 68 miles

On this tour you will drive to Lake Arrowhead on a different route than taken on the Poker Run, along the south shore of Big Bear Lake. Once in Arrowhead you will make a loop of the lake through rural and suburban areas. Arrowhead is a very popular place for vacation homes, and they range from the modest to the extravagant. Once around the lake, you will arrive at the Lake Arrowhead Resort and Spa where you might take your lunch. The route back is along the north shore of Big Bear Lake, but in the opposite direction as you drove before.



Once you reach the Mountain Station—elevation 8,516 feet—enjoy two restaurants, observation decks, natural history museum, two documentary theaters, gift shop and over 50 miles of hiking trails.
